Theft of significant potted plants from Australian National Botanic Gardens

A range of significant and unique potted plant specimens, many of which have important historic and conservation value and would be difficult (or in some cases impossible) to replace, has been stolen from the ANBG. A list of plant species is available [here](#), in the hope that some may be found and returned. Some trees are 20+ years old. The list identifies some trees that have been specifically identified as possible bonsai subjects.
